"You really believe this stuff!" Perhaps the most consequential compliment I ever received as a preacher. {...Not that there have been that many....} Fred (a pseudonym) was a regular attender of our church. He was however, candid in stating his skepticism of the supernatural, and thus, the Bible. Hence, while he and I cordially interacted with mutual respect; he quite frankly, thought I was nuts. As his pastor, he liked my preaching, yet I have no idea why! He did not buy the core message of Salvation through the cross of Christ. But, at least he believed! believed.

You are surely aware that I consistently sound a clarion call for transforming encounter with Jesus Christ. I don't ever want there to be any doubt what I'm about. —There isn't. (c.f. I Cor 2:2)

I've been preaching the gospel nearly four decades. No plans to stop. I am utterly convinced this truth works. For me; anything else, would be something less. At this age and stage in life, occasionally I am asked, "How long are you going to do this?" My answer:

- People are still lost.
 - ◆ The Blood still saves.
 - ◆ I'm still called.
 - …Preach on!

When training in Personal Evangelism, I employ the illustration of a Shoe Salesman. Trying to convince me to purchase shoes from him; invariably, I find myself examining $-\underline{his}$ shoes. Same goes with my preaching. For someone to buy what I'm selling, I best embrace and embody what I'm espousing.

Across the nation and around the world, I have personally witnessed Jesus Christ transform individuals. I can name names. Most remarkably, one of those names —is mine. Paul captured the quintessential qualification for a minister, "But having the same spirit of faith, as is written, "I believed, therefore I spoke," we also believe, therefore we also speak" (II Cor 5:13). I thus move in for the 'kill' with my application point. Be advised and be prepared. I will continue to relentlessly "proclaim Him, admonishing every man so that we may present them complete in Christ." (Col 1:28). Don't just follow this ministry as a casual spectator or sympathetic fan (or even enthusiastic supporter). My purpose is not benevolent activity, winsome entertainment, or spiritual travel log. I am in the search and rescue business. "Seek and save the lost" (Lk 19:10). Hence, pointedly I set my sights on you too, my reader! Echoing Scripture to the Romans, "I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God unto salvation to everyone who believes."
